Having a Good Report Card Conversation With Your Child

The support of parents is a key ingredient for students to be successful, not only in school but also in life. Report cards offer a framework for having a conversation with our children about their progress, about their passions and about their lives.

My first suggestion for a good conversation is to focus on comments and growth – not letter grades. It would be easy if letter grades would be able to indicate whether a child is and will be successful but that is not the case. Time after time when students' letter grades are compared to their success in University, in business and in life there is no connection. Google "Do grades really matter" to find further information on this. As I have conversations with my sons, now in University, about their report cards the conversations are not about grades but more about their passions, what they've learned and what they are going to do next. Don't get me wrong, I want all students to achieve excellence but excellence isn't necessarily an A in every subject for every student.

One area that I find is often overlooked when people read report cards is the number of lates. I've interviewed hundreds of people for jobs and been asked for references on hundreds of people as well but can't recall ever asking or being asked about letter grades. However, I always want to know about and am always asked about lates. I won't hire someone who is habitually late and when I give a reference that says someone is often late, they don't get that job. I know that getting our children to school on time takes work but it is worthwhile and is extremely important.

In reading through the report cards for our Taylor Park students I often smile as I see teachers commending students for their growth over the past term and remarking about a project or area that shows their unique abilities and personality. Some of the questions I like to ask students after a report card are: "What did you like the most this past term?" "What are you most proud about accomplishing this past term?" "In what way(s) have you grown over this past term?" These kinds of questions show we care about and believe in them. As a result of realizing we believe in them they are more motivated to do their best – and to show their work and talk about it with us.

I hope that through your conversations with your child they will know of your unconditional love and your passionate desire to support them in being successful.
