## Report Cards - Making Learning Visible

Our report cards for the first term will be coming out this week. Mr. Heard and I have been thrilled to read all the reports and to see the progress students have made. The questions we as parents ask and our response can make a big difference in the mindset of our children. I recommend looking at the comments more than letter grades or performance scales and asking some questions like some of those below. Throughout BC and all over the world letter grades are losing their importance as students are demonstrating their abilities. Universities are no longer basing entrance requirements solely on grades and some have even removed that criteria as they want to find the best students and letter grades don't necessarily reflect that. My oldest son is in Law school and I am still using questions like those below to confirm the things he's done well and then inspire and equip him to do well for the next term. As a result, he is open to telling me what goes well and what doesn't and we even study together and look at his research projects. A report card is a great way to find the passions your child has and enable them to grow in that area – perhaps eventually finding a job in that area. A good way to start is to thank your child for bringing the report card and say something like," I'm looking forward to seeing what you've learned!" Some questions and comments to consider for the discussion of the report card are:

- What are you proud of accomplishing this past term?
- What did you enjoy doing the most?
- How do you feel about this report card?
- Are your grades and work habit marks what you expected?
- What are your goals for this coming term?
- What can we do at home to help you accomplish your goals?

Think of specific helpful comments to make about your child's report card. Comments like, "That's a good report," or "I'm disappointed" don't have the desired kind of impact compared to comments like, "I've seen you put a lot of effort into your math this term and I'm really proud of you for working hard." Or "It seems like math has taken a lot of time and been frustrating for you this past term. What can we do to help for this next term?" Your child's teachers want them to be successful so if you have questions, don't hesitate to contact them and arrange an appointment.
