Ways To Support Your Child's Learning At Home During The Summer:

I'm looking forward to summer vacation and I know many students are as well but that doesn't mean we want to stop learning. Learning should be an enjoyable activity and can help us develop our skills and character as well as providing a great deal of enjoyment. I gave books as gifts for the summer and I have about ten books I will be reading this summer. I will be learning new exercises, building garden structures, hiking and more

- Join the free summer reading program sponsored by the Burnaby Public Library.
- Have your child read daily for a minimum of 30 minutes to maintain and continue developing their reading fluency. On occasion, read to your child or have them read out loud to you. If they can read in their first language that is also good.
- Provide reading materials at your child's reading level that he/she finds interesting (e.g. visit the public library and let him/her choose books, buy a magazine or newspaper, etc.).
- To aid with comprehension, ask your child questions about what they're reading. Ask them to predict what will happen at various points in a story, make connections and summarize the main ideas or retell the story in their own words.
- Have your child write in a journal about his/her summer activities; encourage writing complete sentences with proper capital letters and punctuation, using a variety of sentences (?, ., !) and adding details to describe events e.g.) feelings, 5 W's (who, what, when, where, why), adjectives (describing words)...
- Encourage your child to write stories, poems, or letters to friends and relatives. They could write a story about a picture (in a book, on a postcard, in a magazine...), or they could write a new ending to a story they've read, or a sequel to a book they've finished.
- Make up and orally tell stories together. One person can start, and then alternate turns. Try it alternating every word, or every sentence, or every few sentences... Enjoy lots of giggles using your imaginations!
- Get involved in day to day math activities at home such as making a grocery list, planning for shopping, and going to the store and using money. Review basic math facts e.g.) addition (7+8=15), subtraction (17-8=9), multiplication (4x5=20).
- Search the computer for some fun math sites to review skills learned this year.
- Play math and board games together. e.g.) Monopoly, cribbage, dice or card games...
- Encourage your child to tell time using 12-hour and 24-hour digital and analog clocks.
- Allow your child to help with tasks requiring the counting of money (e.g. paying for items at a store or counting piggy bank money.)
- Develop creative skills through learning to paint or draw (YouTube is great) or develop dancing and musical skills
- Develop cooking skills be trying new recipes
- Develop athletic skills by spending time in the park with a soccer ball or joining a sports team
- Have a fun summer and enjoy your time together as a family!
