## **Learning from Failure**

If we're not making any mistakes, then we're not learning. If we're not taking any risks, then we're not growing. One of the reasons we give our students opportunities to try new things like leadership in the class or the school, performing in front of a class or the school, learning to play an instrument or play with the Rock Band is that it is something new and something that is important for others – and we learn that none of us is perfect! Through trying these new things, we can learn to support other people, have patience with ourselves and accept our mistakes and the mistakes of others. We all need to let go of our fear of failure, because it can keep us from reaching our potential. When we run into problems, it can help us learn to be patient if we have the right mindset. Patience develops strength of character. Failure has a way of softening our hearts. It helps us grow up and become more mature. It makes us sensitive to others. It makes us less judgmental and helps us be a little more sympathetic to people around us. Failure doesn't automatically grow our character. Sometimes we unfairly define ourselves or others by our failures instead of looking at our growth and success. Failure only builds our character when we look at it with the right perspective. So... applying this to our students, the next time our students make a mistake, don't do well on a test, make a mistake while playing sports or performing let's acknowledge what has happened let's celebrate their growth with them, show how to support each other, accept our failures and look forward to the next opportunity knowing we can forgive ourselves and have the support of others. by Mr. Wall
