#### **Capoeira Martial Arts**

Taylor Park is excited to announce that students will get the opportunity to learn Capoeira Martial Arts. Capoeira ("kap-oo-ayrah") is an Afro-Brazilian martial art form that combines music, selfdefence, dance, acrobatics, and physical

conditioning to create a unique, multidisciplinary experience. Capoeira is one of the most inherently diverse martial arts in the

world today, with creativity, music, self-expression, and strategic thinking as much a part of the core curriculum as physical training and fitness.

Cost is \$10 per student and can be paid on School Cash online. All classes will be participating during school hours from **March 31<sup>st</sup> – April 11<sup>th</sup>.**


